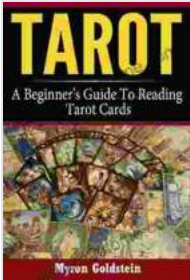

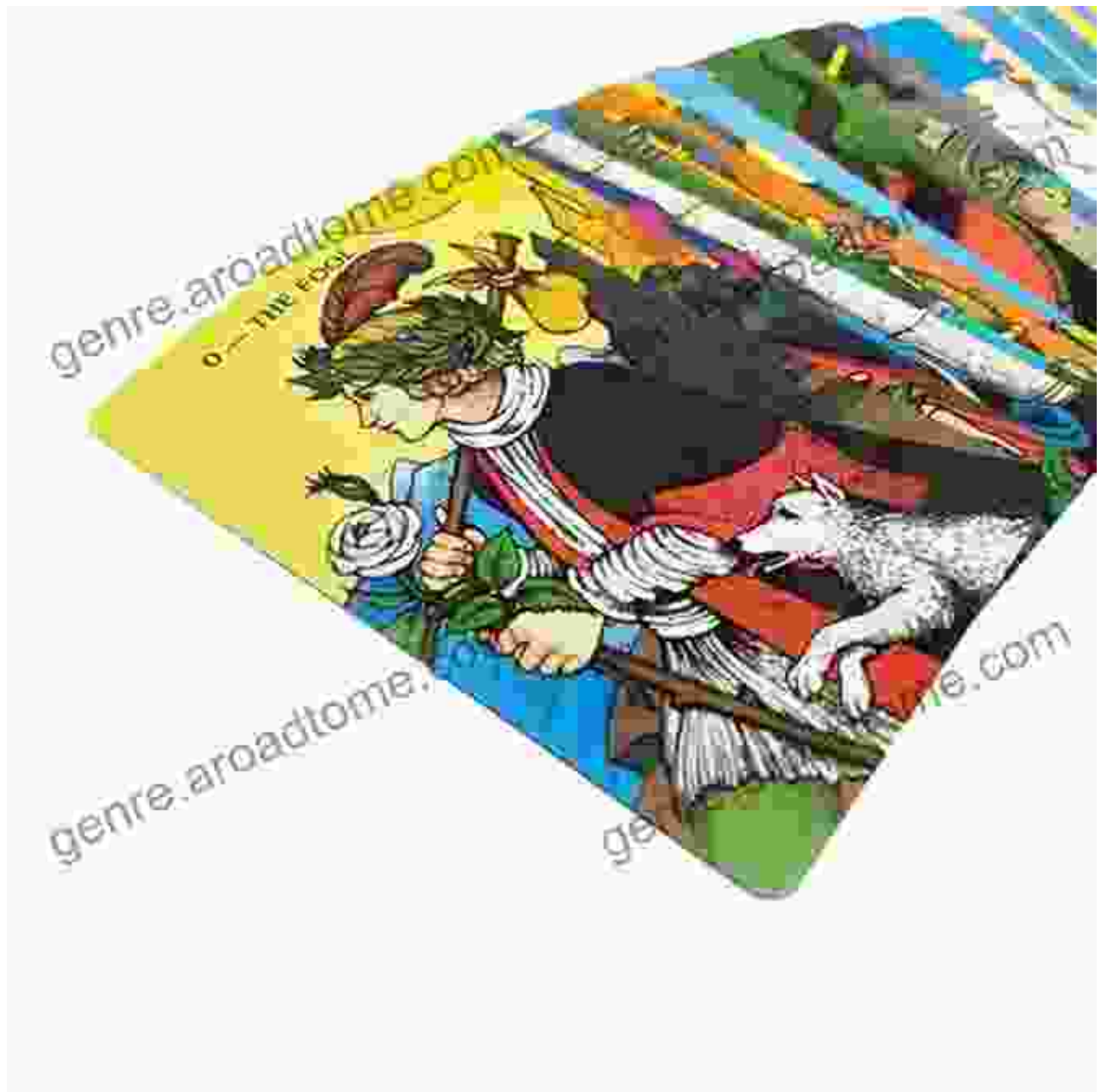

Each suit represents one of the four elements of fire, air, earth or water, and corresponds to a different area of our life and experiences. In the 111 tarot deck, the four suits are represented by pentacles, cups, swords and wands. The meanings of each of these suits is explained over the page.

The suits in a Tarot reading: If most of the cards that come up in a Tarot reading are from the same suit, this tells you that there is one main issue affecting everything. If you want a quick 'aha' moment, you may want to take the suit that appears most often in each suit – and pick one or two lines to reveal the root of the issue.

Each of the suits is associated with one of the four elements of earth, air, fire and water.



DIFFERENCES BETWEEN DECKS

Every Tarot deck must contain the four suits, and has the same symbols, but the objects and depictions may vary. The names given to each of these suits may change, and the symbols may be different. The meanings behind them remain the same.

Every Tarot deck has four suits, although the objects and depictions may change drastically.

PENTACLES

CUPS

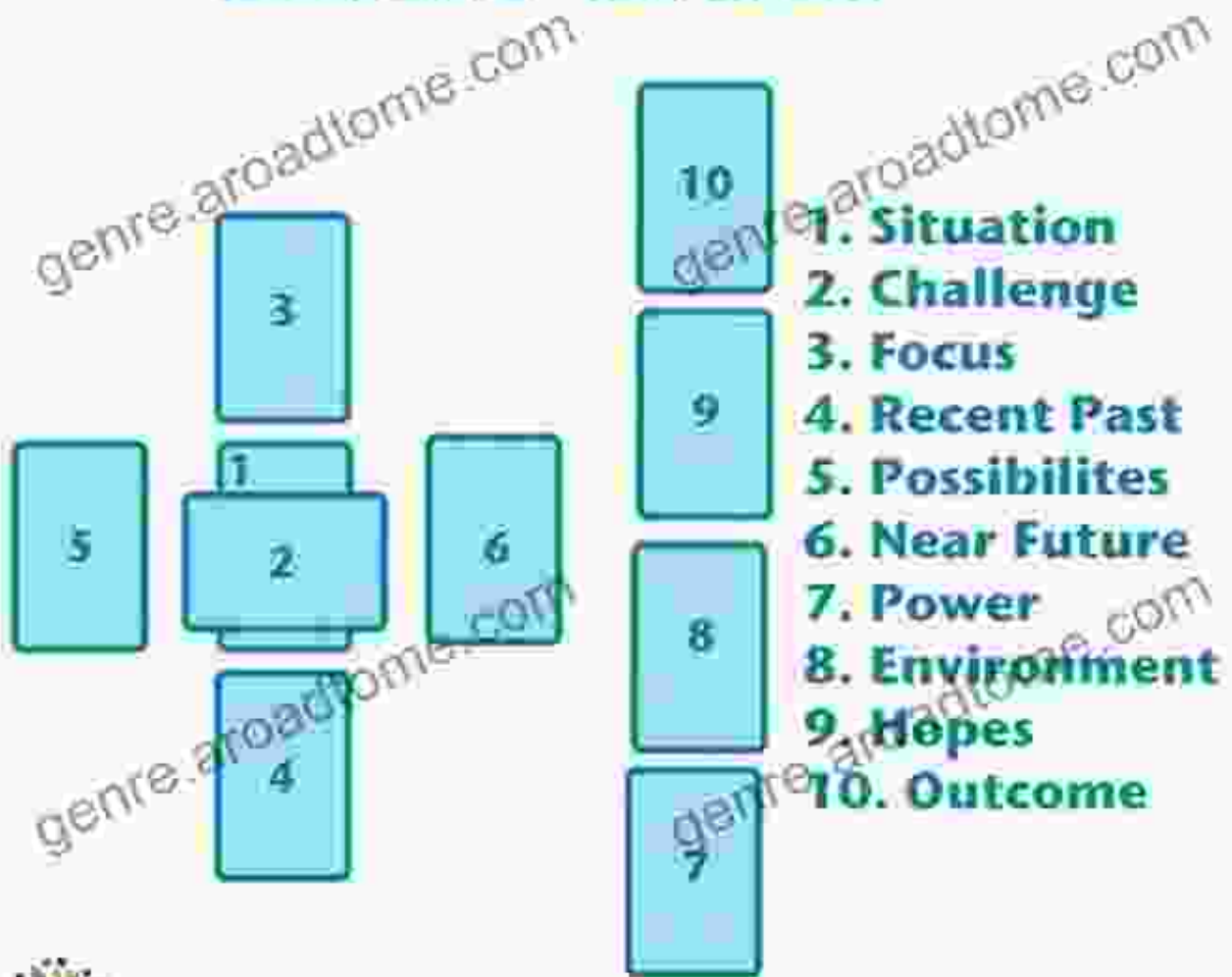

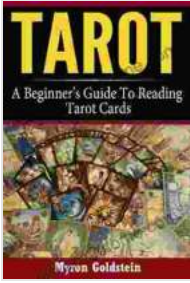

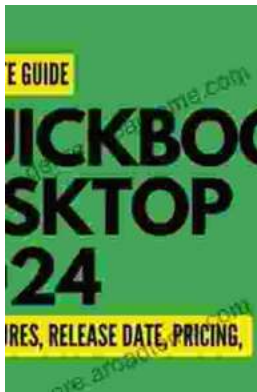
